Town of Halifax Driveway, Highway, and Trail Right-of-Way Use Permit

Anyone or any corporation intending to use any part of the Town right-of-way must obtain a right-of-way use permit, prior to use. Notwithstanding any other statutory requirement, a permit shall be required for any use of any highway right-of-way, consistent with the provisions of Title 19 V.S.A. 1111.

Permit application and a processing fee of \$30.00 needs to be submitted to the Board of Selectmen made payable to the Town of Halifax, P.O. Box 127, West Halifax, VT 05358.

ATTENTION: Failure to obtain an approved permit to commencing work may result in your restoring the area to its original condition and will result in double the application fee, as well as, any other legal action the Selectboard may determine necessary. Further, an approved permit is only valid for work done within the Town Right-of-Way.

ATTENTION: It is your responsibility to acquire any other necessary permits that you might need in relation to the work you are proposing, prior to starting work.

DRIVEWAY STANDARDS

As approved by the Board of Selectmen on August 16, 1983 and amended November 21, 1996

Driveways or secondary approaches will be constructed as follows:

- 1. Each lot owner, prior to connecting to a town highway will obtain a permit from the Selectboard.
- 2. No drainage from driveways shall be permitted onto the town highway.
- 3. The need for a culvert will be determined by the Road Commissioner prior to approval.
- 4. The purchase, placement, repair and maintenance of said culverts will be the responsibility of the lot owner.
- 5. Driveways will intercept town roads at a 75-degree to 90-degree angle and will slope downward from the highway one-half (1/2) inch per foot for a minimum of 15 feet.
- 6. Temporary driveways are permitted provided they do not interfere with the normal ditch line.
