Principal's Report

The District's Administrative Team had our first, of two half day trainings, with <u>Equity Solutions</u>. A group from Brattleboro Vermont that'....provides engaging and innovative trainings and consulting services for state agencies, social service organizations, schools, and businesses so



participants gain tools for strong client, staff, and leadership/management relationships. These strong relationships create a work environment where all are valued and thriving, and can actively contribute to a collective response to root causes of economic and racial inequity." They are supporting our team as we work together to apply an equity framework to our joint work, including thinking about how we can bring this work to the schools that we lead. There are many components to this work. Included are some of the learning objectives included in our work:

- Build skills on the leadership team for uncomfortable conversations
- Practice interrupting assumptions/bias related to race and class
- Practice applying a racial and socioeconomic equity framework to school culture, policies and decisions at our SU

I will be sharing my learning, and the work that we as District leaders are embarking on, throughout this year. This work will be ongoing, and we will be identifying ways to tie it to our Continuous Improvement Plans.
