I am pleased to offer my second letter to you, the community members that comprise Windham Southwest Supervisory Union. It is a privilege to continue to serve as your Superintendent. Over the past year and eight months, I have been able to get to know the many wonderful people that work across our supervisory union. Wow, we have such a capable and caring team of people! I am particularly impressed by our faculty and staff's dedication and passion. Furthermore, we have board members and community partners who demonstrate a deep and long commitment to our schools. It is clear that it is our shared ethic of care and hard work that makes Windham Southwest Supervisory Union special.

While we at WSWSU are proud of our people and their accomplishments, we know that the work must continue. Windham Southwest continues to be on the path of transformation to create schools that provide learning environments where every child succeeds. We are moving steadily forward on this path with enthusiasm and a sense of urgency to reach our goals. We take the responsibility of every child's learning seriously and understand that every moment counts for our children. The direction in which we are moving is outlined in our Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP). Our CIP plan is a multi-year action plan that has three major components that together guide the work that we are doing:

- 1. Improve student learning and ensure students are proficient in, or demonstrate mastery in, the core subject areas and transferable skills (the soft skills needed to succeed in the workplace): a.k.a. Proficiency Based Learning
- 2. Make learning more personalized, meaningful and engaging: a.k.a. Personalized Learning
- 3. Ensure that we have safe and healthy schools where students have their social and emotional needs met and are ready to learn.

All WSWSU professionals are invested in this important work. The WSWSU Administrative Leadership Team facilitates this work among our educators to realize these goals. This year we have been focusing on creating a more effective Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTSS) at every school. We view our MTSS as a vehicle to reach our goal of improving student learning, and ensuring students are proficient in the core subject areas, social emotional skills, and transferable skills. We have identified that an effective MTSS includes the following components:

- High quality instruction and intervention in academics and social emotional learning
- Comprehensive assessment
- Expertise
- Effective collaboration
- Constant decision making for excellence and equity
- A culture of continuous improvement

Across WSWSU we are engaged in professional development to support our work around MTSS and our CIP. We aim to foster environments where students are ready to learn and can master what they need to learn. We are committed to offering the best education for our students and we will not stop working towards every child reaching their full potential.

Lastly, and most importantly, I want to express my appreciation to the residents and taxpayers for your continued support of the students in our districts. We can not do the important work that we do without you. Thank you.

Principal's Report

SVUUSD Principal, Sandra Pentak-Cohen The Southern Valley Unified Union School District at Halifax and Readsboro students, staff and families continue to work together to create an environment that encourages lifelong learning in an ever-changing world.

Teachers have continued to integrate into their work the principles found in Sean Cain's book; *Fundamental Five*. This focus applies to all academic



areas; Framing the lesson so that students know what they are expected to learn, working in the power zone, engaging in frequent, small group, purposeful talk, recognizing and reinforcing the behaviors and skills we expect of students, and having students frequently engage in critical writing tasks.



Our staff, along with other District employees, participated in a book study; *Fostering Resilient Learners*, by Kristin Souers and Pete Hall. This provided teachers with another opportunity to

understand what childhood trauma is and how it can profoundly affect learning. This work, at our District and school levels, is so important as we are having more and more children entering our schools having experienced some kind of traumatic event. One take away from all of this work is the need to build strong relationships. This is core to our schools; we strive to develop meaningful relationships with each of our students and their families.

These District and school-based initiatives speak directly to our Continuous Improvement Plan Goals; To improve our tier 1 instruction, create tier 2 interventions and establish consistency in our assessment practices. To develop a more formalized process for personalized learning and to develop safe and healthy trauma informed schools.

We welcomed new teachers and support staff to both of our schools this year. At our Readsboro campus we welcomed Ms. Marissa Navedo 5th/6th grade teacher, Mrs. Alma Jane Hart our Music teacher, Mr. Jakob



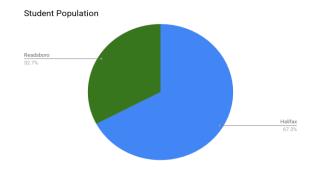
Trautwein our PE teacher, and Ms. Diane Wheeler a para educator At the Halifax campus we welcomed Ms. Na'alie Humphrey 3rd/4th grade teacher, Mr. Jakob Trautwein our PE teacher, Kristina Benson our part-time ELA teacher and Ms. Allison Corey a paraeducator. This year we combined our 7th and 8th graders at the Halifax campus. It has been a wonderful experience for the students, they have learned to stretch their thinking, embrace new concepts and collaborate in new ways. This larger group

allows for many different voices to be heard, and new perspectives to consider. It is an ideal number of students, twenty-two



altogether, and ensures a lively learning experience.

SVUUSD student population currently totals 114. Our Halifax campus is K-8th grade with a student enrollment of 76. Our Readsboro campus is Pre-K-6th grade, with a student enrollment of 38.



SCHOOL WARNING SOUTHERN VALLEY UNIFIED UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT

The legal voters of the Southern Valley Unified Union School District are hereby notified to meet at the School Auditorium at the Twin Valley Middle High School, in the Town of Whitingham, Vermont on Thursday, February 27, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. to act on Articles VII, VIII, IX and X of the School District Warning.

The meeting will then be adjourned until Tuesday, March 3, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. for voting on the remaining articles by Australian Ballot. For this purpose the polls will open at 10:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m.

ARTICLE I

To elect a Moderator, by Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE II

To elect a Clerk, by Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE III

To elect a Treasurer, by Australian Ballot

ARTICLE IV

To elect all Southern Valley Unified Union School Directors as required, by Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE V

To see if the voters of the Southern Valley Unified Union School District will authorize the School Board to pay the School District Clerk \$20 per hour not to exceed \$375 annually for his/her duties with the School District, by Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE VI

To see if the voters of the Southern Valley Unified Union School District approve the School Board to expend \$3,381,021, which is the amount the School Board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year. It is estimated that this proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of \$16,960 per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 23.6% higher than spending for the current year. To be voted by Australian Ballot.

ARTICLE VII

To hear the report of the Southern Valley Unified Union School District Officers and act thereon.

ARTICLE VIII

To see if the Southern Valley Unified Union School District will vote to authorize the School Directors to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE IX

To see if the Southern Valley Unified Union School District will vote to authorize the School Directors to deposit into a reserve fund, anticipated surplus funds at June 30, 2020, for the purpose of maintaining the facilities and/or emergency repairs, pursuant to 24 VSA §2804.

ARTICLE X

To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

MINUTES TOWNS OF HALIFAX AND READSBORO SOUTHERN VALLEY UNIFIED UNION SCHOOL DISTICT ANNUAL MEETING

Pursuant to notice the inhabitants of the Town of Halifax and the Town of Readsboro, Vermont, who are legal voters in the Southern Valley Unified Union School District (SVUUSD) met at the Twin Valley Middle High School Auditorium in Whitingham, Vermont, on the evening of Thursday, February 28, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. for the 2nd Annual Meeting of the Southern Valley Unified Union School District.

Moderator Paul G. Blais called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.

Moderator Blais called for a moment of silence in memory of those who had passed away and who have extended kindness.

Homer Summer, Chairman to the Board led the voters in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Plag.

The town officers were introduced: Clerk of the Board – Tina Blais, Chairman of the Board, Homer Sumner; Stephanie Powers; Mary King, Sue Bailey and Caroline Sprague. At this time Principal, Sandy Pentak-Cohen; Superintendent Of Schools, Barbara Anne Komous-Montroll; and WSWSU Business Manager, Karen Atwood were also introduced. Moderator Blais gave the guidelines for the conduct of the meeting and read the Southern Valley Unified Union School District Warning in its entirety.

The following business was transacted:

ARTICLE I	To elect a Moderator, by Australian Ballot.
ARTICLE II	To elect a Clerk, by Australian Ballot.
ARTICLE III	To elect a Treasurer, by Australian Ballot
ARTICLE IV	To elect (2) School Directors for three (3) years terms each, by Australian Ballot.
ARTICLE V	To see if the voters of the SVUUSD will authorize the school board to pay the School District Treasurer \$3,000 annually for his/her duties with the School District, by Australian Ballot.
ARTICLE VI	To see if the voters of the SVUUSD will authorize the school board to pay the School District Clerk \$20 per hour not to exceed \$250 annually for his/her duties with the School District, by Australian ballot.
ARTICLE VII	To see if the voters of the SVUUSD approve the School Board to expend \$2,819,314, which is the amount the School Board has determined to be necessary for the ensuing fiscal year. It is estimated that this proposed budget, if approved, will result in education spending of \$13,596 per equalized pupil. This projected spending per equalized pupil is 5,45% lower than spending for the current year. To be voted on by Australian Ballot.
ARTICLE VIII	Lewis Sumner moved that the towns hear the reports of the SVUUSD Officers and act thereon. Marylou Parkhurst seconded the motion. Hearing no discussion Moderator Blais moved on to Article IX.
ARTICLE IX	Lewis Sumner moved that the SVUUSD will vote to authorize the School

so passed.

ARTICAL X

Directors to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Patricia Dow seconded the motion. Article IX was so voted and Moderator Blais declared Article IX

Larry Hopkins moved to pass over to see if the SVUUSD will vote to authorize the School directors to deposit into a reserve fund, anticipated

surplus funds at June 30, 2019, for the purpose of maintaining the facilities and/or emergency repairs, pursuant to 24 VSA § 2804. Moderator Blais explained that this is called suspend the rules and a second is needed as well as two thirds vote. Dave Marchegiani seconded the motion. The motion to suspend the rules for Article X was so voted and declared defeated by Moderator Blais. Lewis Summer moved to see if the SVUUSD will vote to authorize the School Directors to deposit into a reserve fund, anticipated surplus funds at June 30, 2019, for the purpose of maintaining the facilities and/or emergency repairs, pursuant to 24 VSA § 2804. The motion was seconded by Patricia Dow.

Marylou Parkhurst asked for an explanation/clarification of the reserve fund. Summer explained that there is no fund yet but if there is a fund balance part of that fund balance could be established into a reserve fund on its own to be used in case of building repairs or emergencies.

Parkhurst asked if it would be able to roll over from year to year. Summer replied that yes it would roll over from year to year. Hopkins raised his concern over the Article, it seems as if it is giving the board a blank check to do whatever they want with. Thinks that the Board would have to establish fund, report the fund to the voters, then put it into an article to be voted on each year at the annual meeting. Thinks the reserve fund is a good idea article just needs to be written in a different order. Moderator Blais explained that he talked with JP Isabelle, from the Vermont Secretary of State's office, to get a better understanding of the Article. It was explained to him that the Article could be amended to two parts and he was pointed to the VLCT Model Article. If it were an Australian ballot, it would have to be worded as one Article to both create the account and to fund the account. For a floor vote an amendment is still permissible to split the article into two parts. It is up to the discretion of the moderator as to whether they would permit the amendment. There is no law that requires a dollar amount. A new Article would have to be voted on each year as it is only good for one vear.

Dave Marchegiani brought up how the Readsboro Select Board handles their reserve fund. Moderator Blais stated that the Article was Drafted by the attorney for the Southern Valley Unified Union School District in conjunction with the VT Secretary of State's office, and he will consider it germane.

Summer explained when you do a Town budget you are using line items which allow the residents to vote on them, and when doing the school budget there are no line items.

Sumner explained that the fund balance is for use for two years from now. Hopkins asked how they came up with what the fund number was going to be. Sumner replied that they have no idea what the number is going to be that is why it is anticipated surplus. We really have no idea what is going to happen during the year, that is why it is anticipated. Hopkins asked if they knew they were going to have this fund why didn't they just put a dollar amount in such as \$50,000 and make it clear and simple? Moderator Blais asked if he was still referring to the Article that was written by DA J.P. the answer was yes. Sumner went on to explain that Halifax had never had a reserve fund before and that he was going into it blind. If you have a fund balance and you don't put it into a reserve fund by June 30, as of July 1 it turns into revenue because you have missed the deadline. Paul N. Blais motioned to call the question and Patricia Dow seconded ending Debate. It was voted to end the debate on Article X. Article X was so voted and Moderator Blais declared Article X so passed.

Article XI

Patricia Dow moved to transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting. Paul N. Blais seconded. Hopkins expressed his concern over the fact that the numbers in the warrant had changed from the time it was posted in Readsboro, to the Readsboro informational meeting and they were even different when read by Moderator Blais at the Annual meeting tonight. Also, that the warrant was not correctly posted in Readsboro. Moderator Blais asked what he read wrong and was told that is was the total

for the expenditure in Article VII. Also, that the School report said that we would be discussing Articles VII, VIII, IX, X, and XI. We only discussed VIII, IX, X, and XI. Hopkins also stated that there were errors on page I1 of the School Report. Hopkins read out examples for the people. Parkhust asked Sumner if a postcard could be mailed out with the date and time of the informational meeting as they were not aware of it. That is something that the board will consider next year. Sumner asked Marchegiani if the Readsboro Select Board sent out informational post cards to the voters for their annual Town Meeting and Marchegiani said no they just post in the legal places required.

Marchegiani explained how the Readsboro Select Board has handled reserve funds in the past but understands that the select Board and School Board operate differently. More discussion ensued about Article X with members sharing ideas as to how to handle it. Sumner tried to clarify details. At this time moderator Blais read 24 VSA § 2804. Hopkins asked how the tax payers would know if they were getting good results from the students for their tax money. Homer explained that at the E Board meeting he just attended, he heard very positive results. Sandy Pentak-Cohen explained about the schools having a flier that goes out weekly with information on the projects the students were involved in as well as a Principals report that gives little more info into about the academic side. She stated that anyone can sign up for it to be either emailed or mailed to them.

Lewis Summer moved to adjourn this meeting until Tuesday, March 5, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. to vote on the remaining Australian Ballot Questions. Paul N. Blais seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:02 p.m.
